




#### Geographic Origin




#### Diversity of Fall '08 Full-time Undergrads





#### **Time Elapsed From Graduation to Acceptance** of Full-time Employment (2006-07 **Undergraduate Degree Recipients)**






#### **Educational Expenditures**




# **Instruction and Academic Support Expenses** as Percent of Total Educational Expenses
