

State and Federal Sources of Financial Aid for Future Teachers

Educational Studies

Golden State Teacher Grant

Up to \$20,000 one-time grant to support students enrolled in CTCapproved teacher preparation programs. Must sign a Teaching Agreement that commits you to teaching in a "high-need field" at a "priority school" for 4 out of the 5 years after obtaining a credential.

Cal Grants

Provides funds that pay for tuition and fees to students meeting financial and academic requirements.

Middle Class Scholarships

For undergraduates and students pursuing a teaching credential with family assets up to \$184,000 and income up to \$184,000.

TEACH Grants

Up to \$4,000/year to students who are completing or plan to complete coursework needed to begin a career in teaching and intend to teach in public or private schools serving low-income students.

Most require a completed FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) or CADAA (California Dream Act Application).
