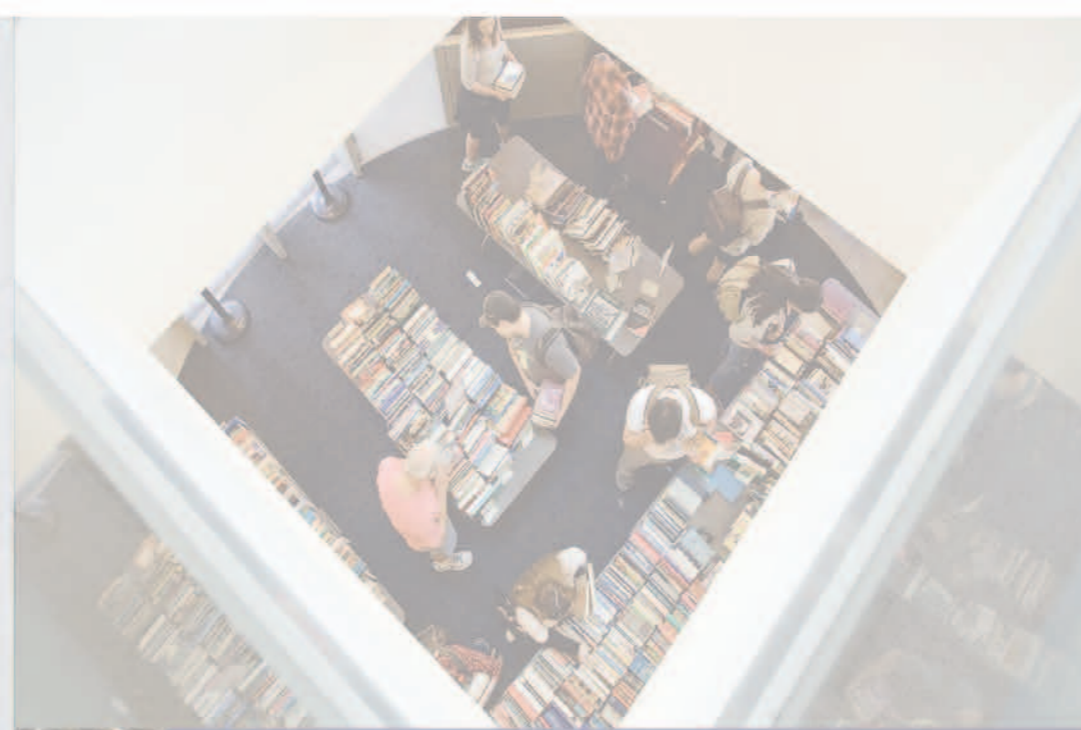


Frank Mt. Pleasant Library of Special Collections and Archives

Leatherby Family Display

This display honors the Leatherby Family and their generations of contributions to Chapman University.



Joyce Marion Chapman Rotunda Cafe

The architectural icon of the building, this rotunda is named for Chapman trustee (and descendant of the Chapman family) Joyce Marion Chapman.

Second Floor

Doti-Struppa Mountaineering Alcove

This alcove showcases the mountain-climbing achievements of President Jim Doti and Chancellor Daniele Struppa.



Dillon Family Map and Geographic Information Center (MAGIC)

MAGIC houses maps and geographic information in one area, streamlining the research process for students, faculty and other researchers.

Doy and Dee Henley Reading Room This spacious reading room houses various rotating exhibitions.

Milton & Rose Friedman Reading Room

Vernon Smith Reading Alcove

Mendez v. Westminster Study Room

In Orange County, 1947 Mexican-American couple Gonzalo and Felicitas Mendez challenged the practice of school segregation in California. Their successful lawsuit paved the way for the 1954 Supreme Court decision "Brown v. Board of Education" which finally put a stop to school segregation.

Gone with the Wind Exhibit

A collection of signed framed photos of the original cast of the celebrated 1939 film, *Gone with the Wind*.



Italian Heritage Archive Group Study Room

This room honors John N. LaCorte, an important member of the Italian-American community.

Illustrations from President Doti's Children's Books

Chapman University President James L. Doti wrote two children's books based on his childhood. This display features the charming illustrations from these books, drawn by Lisa Mertins.



Chuck Jones Collection: The Master's Series

Eleven framed limited-edition lithographs hand-signed by legendary American animator Chuck Jones.

The Jack and Belle Lindquist Disney Collection and Dream Rooms

Jack and Belle Lindquist donated several pieces of Disney memorabilia and art from Jack's time as the first president of Disneyland.

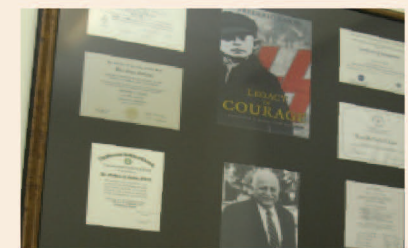


The Yakir Aharonov Alcove
