Evidence-Based Practice Research Paper: 150 points.

Following the Gillam & Gillam (2006) seven-step process to evidence-based practice, students will complete an EBP paper. Using the PICO or PESICO model, students will develop their own foreground question; research the literature to find up to three peer-reviewed articles on their topic, and read and evaluate the literature based on the chosen model. Students will submit a written paper that clearly states the research question (according to the model chosen) and summarizes the articles reviewed; students will indicate the research level/tier of their articles. Students must address each of the seven steps in their paper and follow the example provided. This assignment will be worth 150 points. Papers should be approximately 10-15 pages in length and must follow APA format and style.
