



Highlights/Take Aways:

3 Reasons an Immigration Office (ICE Agent) may visit work place

- To conduct an I-9 investigation and serve a Notice of Inspection
- Arrest or search warrant
- Conducting work place raid investigating an employer
- FYI: It is not aiding and abetting (federal crime) to simply notify the community ice is on campus.

Be prepared if ICE Agents Visit Campus

- Be alert
 - Keep an eye out for gov vehicles (marked and unmarked) and officers
- Be proactive
 - Approach them as soon as possible for the safety of students
 - Inquire about their visit and do not provide any information or location of any student/employee
- Be prepared
 - Have handy Campus Safety/HR numbers
 - Find a location for them to wait and stay with them
