

Echoes of the Great War: American Experiences of World War I will open Tuesday, April 4, in the Southwest Gallery on the second floor of the Library's Thomas Jefferson Building. The Library of Congress holds the largest multiformat collection of materials on the American involvement in World War I. Echoes of the Great War: American Experiences of World War I examines the upheaval of world war as Americans confronted it—both at home and abroad. The exhibition considers the debates and struggles that surrounded U.S. engagement; explores U.S. military and home front mobilization and the immensity of industrialized warfare; and touches on the war's effects, as an international peace settlement was negotiated, national borders were redrawn, and soldiers returned to reintegrate into American society.


