#### PHILOSOPHY MINOR - WORK SHEET

The worksheet below may be useful in planning your philosophy minor. Keep in mind the following general points:

- The minor requires 6 courses total
- At least 3 courses must be upper division (300-400); (that means take no more than 3 lower division courses, numbers 100-200)
- Phil 101 Intro to philosophy is **not** a prerequisite for other philosophy courses.

\*NOTE: If considering law school, taking Phil 300 Symbolic Logic before the LSAT is highly recommended.

NOTE: It is *not* required, but minors are encouraged to take Phil 398 Junior/Senior Seminar. It may be repeated for credit when the topic changes with philosophy chair approval.

NOTE: If you are considering changing from a minor to a major (perhaps a double major with your existing major), see the worksheet for philosophy majors and consult with the philosophy department chair.

NOTE: The major is only 4 more courses than the minor (10 courses total).

- At least 7 of the courses must be upper division.
- Phil 203 OR 300 for logic is required. (If you took 306 it counts as either an elective or a metaphysics / epistemology course).
- Both 310 and 311 are required for the major.
- Phil 398 is required for the major (and is offered every semester).
