
A new course, GD 329A was launched for the first time in the fall of 2022. This upper division course, based on the Stanford Design model, is replacing a Print focused design class with intention to stay relevant with the turning tides of the graphic design industry. This course focuses on design approaches integrating interdisciplinary thinking and creative practices. He has very much enjoyed being back with the students in person after Covid forced courses online. The students in GD 103 are all drawing on IPads or digitally now, which is a perfect evolution of the class and the industry. He is also overseeing seven internships.


Claudine Jaenichen




