

On January 16, 2021, Chapman University was awarded, via the CRRSA Act, a grant in the amount \$8,137,393 of which \$2,752,615 was dedicated to Emergency Financial Aid Grants directly to students.

As of April 16, 2021, Chapman has distributed \$2,721,204 directly to 5,982 students to assist with eligible non-tuition expenses.

The University automatically awarded the grant to all eligible students utilizing information from the FAFSA to determine eligibility criteria. To be eligible a student needed to have a FAFSA on file by March 26 and enrolled at least half-time in the Spring term. Students in all degree-seeking programs were considered. Students with a 0 EFC according to the FAFSA were prioritized and offered an increased amount of funding.

May 5, 2021 update: The University automatically awarded the grant to all eligible new summer GHSC students utilizing information from the FAFSA to determine eligibility criteria. To be eligible a student needed to have a FAFSA on file by May 3rd and enrolled at least half-time in the Summer term. Students with a 0 EFC according to the FAFSA were prioritized and offered an increased amount of funding. In addition, returning students who were enrolled in spring and summer but did not meet the eligibility requirements on March 26th but met them by May 3rd were also awarded.

As of May 5, 2021, Chapman has distributed \$2,752,615.000 directly to 6023 students to assist with eligible non-tuition expenses

Identified students were sent notification of their grant through a direct email as well as a revised financial aid offer letter.

Funds were added to the student's financial aid record and disbursed to their student account. This funding passed through their student account and was refunded to the student based on the options they had previously selected for refunds.
