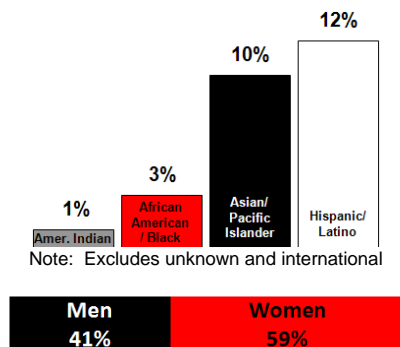

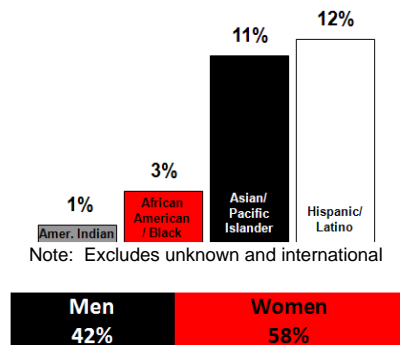
Geographic Origin



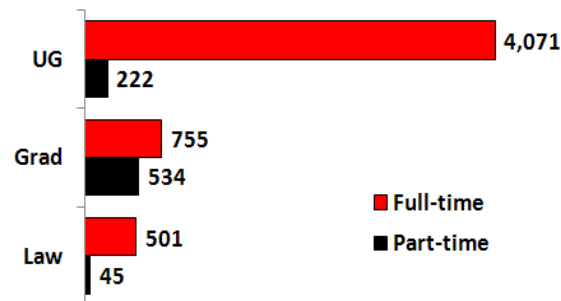
Diversity of Fall '08 Full-time Undergrads

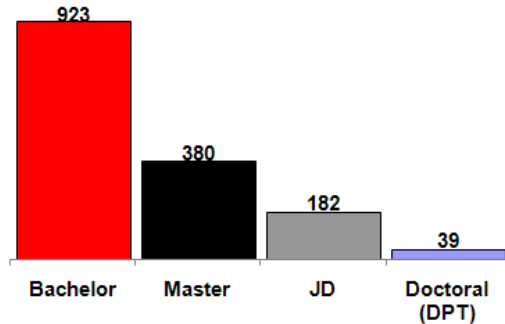

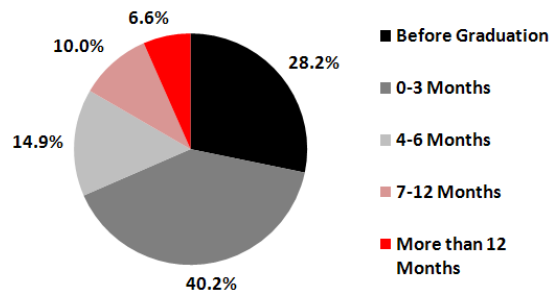

Time Elapsed From Graduation to Acceptance of Full-time Employment (2006-07 Undergraduate Degree Recipients)



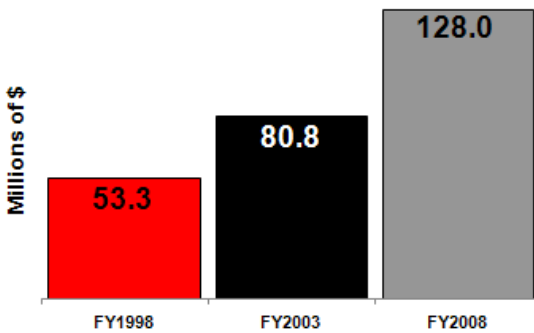

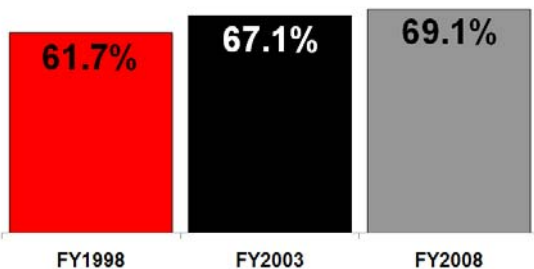

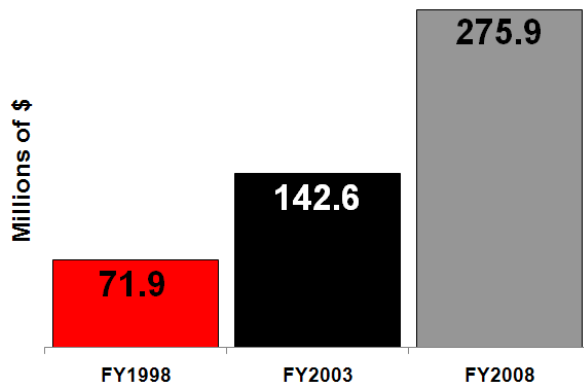
Educational Expenditures



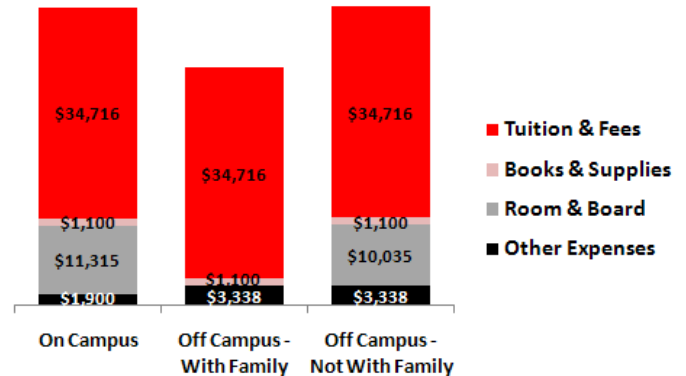
Instruction and Academic Support Expenses as Percent of Total Educational Expenses
