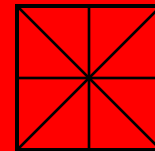

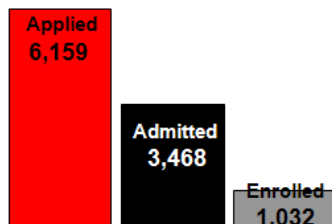

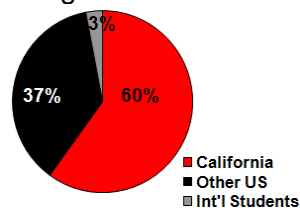

### Fall 2009 Freshman Class Characteristics

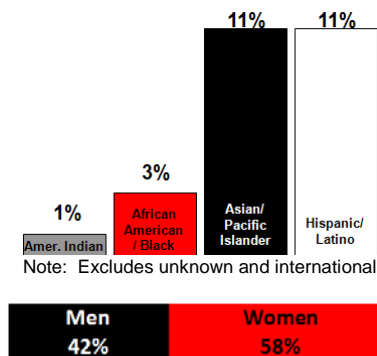

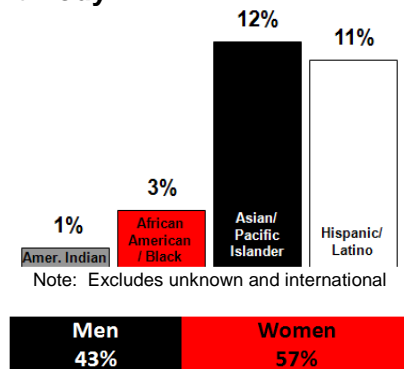
### Geographic Origin



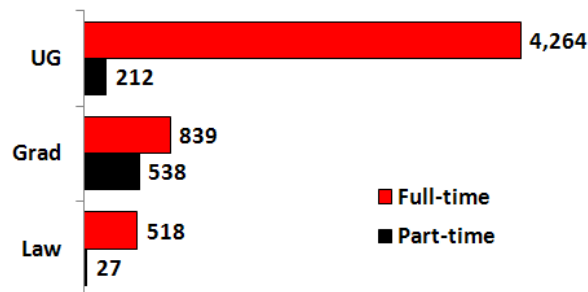
### Diversity of Fall '09 Undergrads

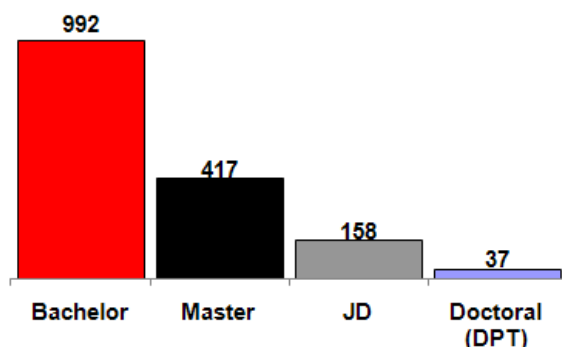

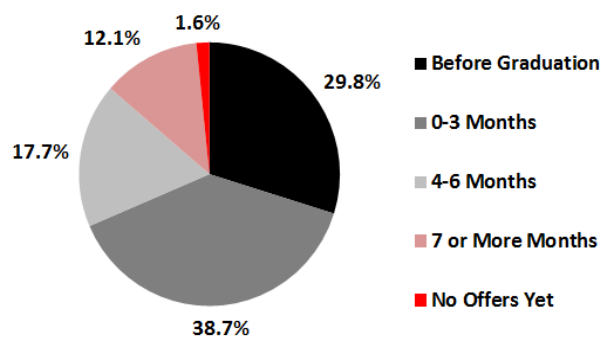

## Time Elapsed From Graduation to Acceptance of Full-time Employment (2007-08 Undergraduate Degree Recipients)



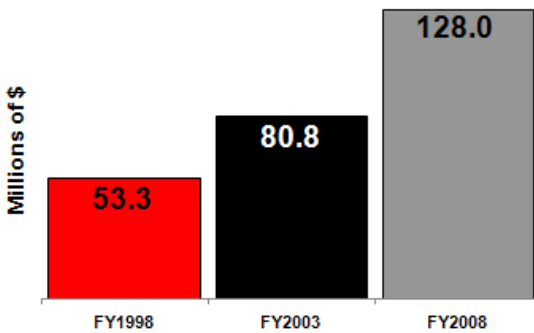

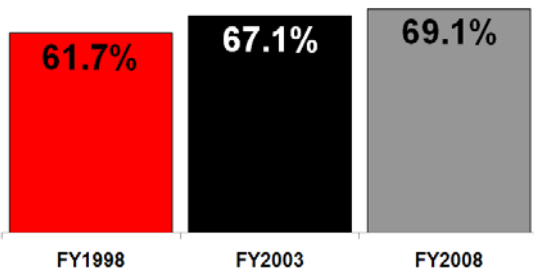

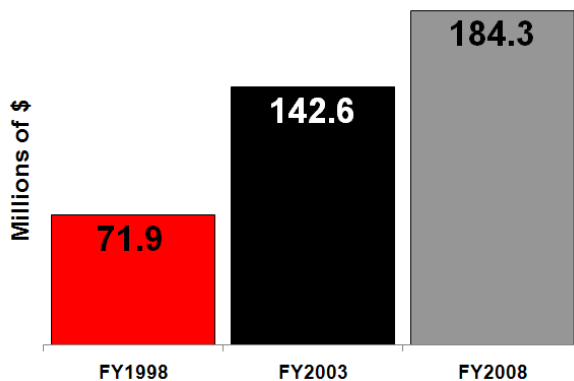
## Educational Expenditures



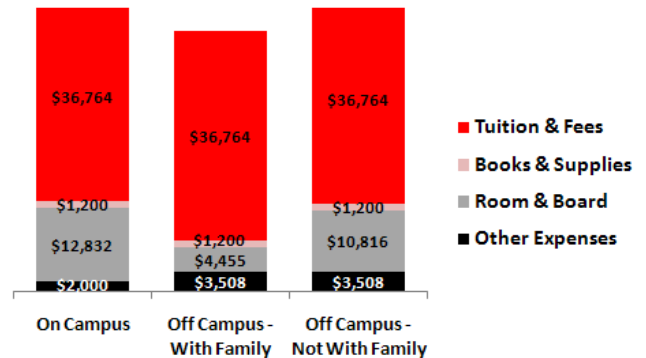
## Instruction and Academic Support Expenses as Percent of Total Educational Expenses
