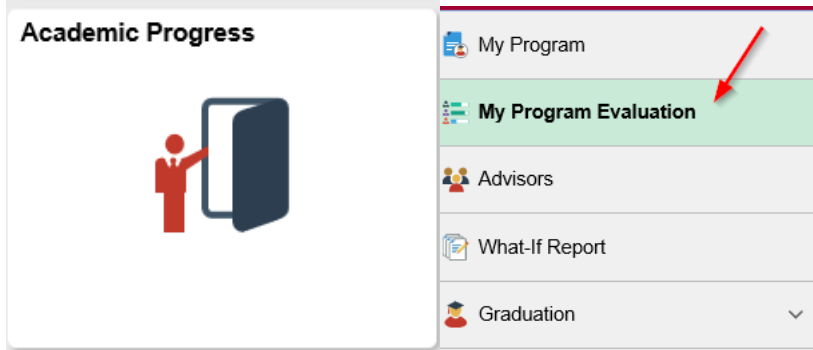

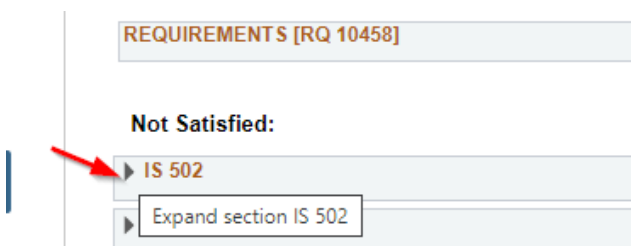
Use “**Collapse All**” or “**Expand All**” button to view all categories that must be completed

Use “**View Report as PDF**” button to view all categories in PDF format (turn off pop-up blockers)

“**Not Satisfied**” vs “**Satisfied**” status for each category

Not Satisfied – means a course(s) or requirement(s) is still outstanding

Satisfied- can sometimes include in progress course(s) so be sure to expand that specific requirement to view if grade is completed or in progress



Collapse All View

- **GRADUATE POLICIES-** displays graduate policies related to minimum graduate credits, residency, cumulative GPA, 7-year program limit information
- **IN PROGRESS COURSES AND OTHER COURSES NOT USED-** lists in progress courses, other courses not used (but still count towards degree totals), ineligible courses such as not meeting minimum grade requirements or courses taken more than seven years prior
- **MAJOR REQUIREMENTS-** lists all courses required for a major including thesis, comprehensive exams, minimum grade and/or GPA requirements
