

**“COMMITMENT TO SERVICE” AWARD PROGRAM
FOR PRO BONO LEGAL WORK**

INFORMATION SHEET

Purpose:

To acknowledge and encourage students to form a habit of providing pro bono legal services, Chapman University School of Law, in partnership with the Public Interest Law Foundation and Externship Program, has created the “Commitment to Service” award to recognize the public interest work of Chapman law students.

Criteria:

- Complete 50 hours of pro bono legal service at non-profit or government entities (judges and courts excluded).
- Can work at multiple locations and/or add up hours over course of law school career.
- For-credit externships, clinic courses, or paid positions do not count, *but* students may complete *extra* hours, with supervisor approval, toward the award.

How to Apply:

- Submit proof of hours worked to Professor Larmore, either:
(1) a timesheet signed by supervisor OR (a2) an email to Professor Larmore directly from supervisor acknowledging hours worked.
- Award given at Graduation Banquet.
